Chapter 5 Key Terms

context dependent- "Qualitative researchers believe that reality is socially constructed and context dependent"

data saturation- nothing new is emerging from the interviews, the researcher keeps recruiting until she or he has all of the data needed.

grand tour question- Research questions are typically broad, encompassing, and written in scientific language. The interview questions may also be broad, like the overview or grand tour question that seeks the "big picture."

inclusion and exclusion criteria- There may be other parameters—called inclusion and exclusion criteria—that the researchers impose as well, such as requiring that participants be older than 18 years, not under the influence of illicit drugs, or experiencing a first pregnancy (as opposed to subsequent pregnancies). When researchers are clear about these criteria, they are able to identify and recruit participants with the experiences needed to shed light on the phenomenon in question.

inductive- qualitative research is explanatory, descriptive, and inductive in nature. It uses words, as opposed to numbers, to explain a phenomenon.

naturalistic setting- Data collection in a qualitative study is usually done in a naturalistic setting, such as someone's home, not in a clinic interview room or researcher's office. This is important in qualitative research because the researcher's observations can inform the data collection. To be in someone else's home is a great advantage, as it helps the researcher to understand what that participant values.

paradigm- all research is based on philosophical beliefs, a worldview, or a paradigm.

qualitative research- Qualitative research is a broad term that encompasses several different methodologies that share many similarities. Qualitative studies help us formulate an understanding of a phenomenon. Nurse scholars who are trained in qualitative methods use these methods to best answer discovery oriented research questions.

theme- The goal of qualitative analysis is to find commonalities and differences in the interviews, and then to group these into broader, more abstract, overarching categories of meaning, sometimes called themes, that capture much of the data.

- **Study design** -> The study design is a description of how the qualitative researcher plans to go about answering the research questions. In qualitative research, there may simply be a

In a multi-programming environment whereby several processes are running on the same processor, it is essential to use scheduling criteria to avoid collisions in the computer's operations. This will help users in a given information technology-oriented firm to share server spaces and resources like printers and file storage spaces. In the multi-tasking environment, a program called CPU scheduler selects one of the ready processes and allocates the processor to it. There are a number of occasions when a new process can or must be chosen to run. When a running process blocks and changes its state to Blocked. When a timer for a running process expires. Different types of scheduling programs referred to as algorithms can be employed in CPU scheduling instances. Among the most popular scheduling algorithms is Shortest Job First (SJF). SJF gives the processor to the process with the shortest next time allocation, known as the burst. If there are processes with similar CPU bursts in the event queue, the scheduler uses First Come First Served algorithm, which allocates the first process to arrive in the queue to the processor regardless of its burst time. It operates under the assumption that the length of the next CPU burst of each of the processes in ready queue is known. CPU scheduling 2013. The SJF algorithm can be used in both pre-emptive and non-pre-emptive methods. The algorithm can be pre-emptive or not. Shortest Job First with pre-emption uses priority measure to determine the next process to be given the CPU. The processes will be having different CPU bursts and different priority levels allocated to them. The process with the least priority magnitude is always picked next. A process already allocated the processor can be pre-empted the CPU and allocation done to another process with higher priority when such a process arrives in the queue. SJF with non-pre-emptive

operates in the normal procedure whereby the job with the least CPU burst in the waiting queue is always picked next for allocation of the CPU and the rest of the processes have to wait no matter their urgency Based on the introduction above it is essential to use the right CPU scheduling strategy to help us achieve
